The warm weather and rain will soon cause the boards to warp.

Mr. Dalton expressed a desire to get rid of the stones that were piled up near his place and you may find it desirable to have these hauled over and the team could profitably put in a full half-day and bring down a few loads from the upper rot for the shore between the two camps. I find the dirt is washing out at high water faster than I can put it in.
